HORTICULTURAL OPERATIONS

During the programme learners will develop a range of core skills in horticultural operations in preparation for working in a horticultural role in a workplace setting. Achieve hands-on practical skills working with hand and mechanical tools in the workplace including maintenance requirements. Gain an understanding for health & safety hazards associated with the horticultural workplace including safe use of a range of tools and machinery.



HORTICULTURAL TAXONOMY AND PLANT IDENTIFICATION

Gain an understanding of plant physiology, plant classification and botanical nomenclature. Guided plant walks carrying out in-depth study of plant stock and developing identification techniques amidst the vast Mount Congreve plant collections. Investigate and become familiar with a range of planting styles and undertake projects in the planning and design of planting schemes for different settings.

PLANT IDENTIFICATION & USE (10 credits)

PLANT HEALTH AND PROTECTION

Undertake pest and disease identification techniques, understand pest life cycles, prevention and control techniques. Explore emerging risks including pests, diseases and weeds and gain insight into plant protection measures and integrated pest management (IPM) practices. Includes introduction to sustainable horticulture principles and practices.

PLANT PROTECTION (15 credits)

FOUNDATION IN BOTANICAL SCIENCES

Develop skills and knowledge across plant and soil sciences, including field experiments, soil analysis techniques, and a variety of laboratory work investigating plant physiology and plant processes. Includes an introduction to biodiversity, exploring a range of habitats across the estate and gaining an understanding of environmental science.

FRUIT AND VEGETABLE PRODUCTION

Develop skills in the planning and execution of small-scale sustainable edible crop production and harvesting (veg and fruit). Training is set within the four acre walled kitchen garden where you will experience the full growing life cycle and develop hands on skills across crop husbandry practices, production programme planning, and crop maintenance. Includes introduction to topics on food sustainability and self sufficiency.

PROPAGATION IN HORTICULTURE

Master a range of propagation techniques and experience propagation onsite across a diverse range of plant species. A unique opportunity to train in the commercial propagation of plants working within one of the largest collections of plants in the world.

INTRODUCTION TO THE HORTICULTURE INDUSTRY

The programme includes a supported linked Work Placement which enables students to spend time working with a local employer and gain invaluable work experience in their chosen field.

TEAMWORK AND COMMUNICATIONS IN THE WORKPLACE

Gain an understanding of team development and operating in multi-team environments with focus on team development and leadership. Develop a range of communication skills applicable for use in the workplace setting, including work related interview preparation techniques and mock interview workshops. IT skills and supports, research and study skills including exam preparation techniques throughout the duration of the programme.

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This one-year training programme is operated in collaboration with the **Waterford & Wexford Education and Training Board**. The programme has been designed to prepare students to work in the Horticulture industry. ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Education:

NFQ Level 4 or equivalent when accessing a QQI Level 5 programme. Mature learner entry requirements available via the local WWETB pathway. For those whose first language is not English, CERFL proficiency at B2 is required for access to Level 5 courses. Additional requirements may apply to non-EU/EEA Applicants and all applications to this programme will be subject to WWETB enrolment criteria.

Aptitude:

Applicants must have the ability to acquire the knowledge, skills and competencies set out in the course

Course Fees:

This is a WWETB funded training initiative and is FREE to all students. There are NO course or registration fees payable to participate on this course. Students applying who are currently in receipt of a social welfare payment from the Department of Social Protection are also eligible to receive a WWETB training allowance while participating on this 48 week programme.

HOW TO APPLY:
